Dear friends of the Center,

May is traditionally a month of celebrations. With Mother's Day, first communions, graduations, weddings, and the Memorial Day holiday, there is much to celebrate in this season.

Here at the Center, May is a very special month for us. It was in May of 1948, when the cornerstone of the first Catholic Information Center was blessed and dedicated

by Bishop Haas. We look forward to celebrating in person with many of you on Friday, May 5 for the 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration.

Since that time, the Paulists have provided innovative ministries to reach out to people in West Michigan. When first invited to the diocese in 1947, the Paulists were designated to provide inquiry classes, especially for non-Catholic spouses; today parishes offer RCIA annually. The Center was one of the first to offer organized ministry to divorced and separated Catholics; today, there are parishes throughout the diocese providing this kind of pastoral care. Finally, with the move to Cathedral Square, the Center was able to begin live streaming our programs, reaching people across the US and other countries; today there is the ongoing exponential growth in live streaming opportunities for people to explore the Catholic faith.

The Paulist Fathers and staff at the Center have been able to be on the leading edge of meeting people's spiritual needs because of friends like you. Whether you have been a friend of the Center from the very beginning or are a new friend this year, we are grateful for the partnership in the Gospel you have with us through your involvement, prayerful support, and regular financial contributions.

The founder of the Paulist Fathers, Isaac Hecker, trusted that the outpouring of the Holy Spirit would provide for "a future brighter than any past". It is not lost on me that the anniversary of the cornerstone blessing this year falls on the same day as Pentecost, celebrating the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on the first disciples.

So, even as we celebrate our 75-year history, we look forward to our continued journey with you into a hope-filled future. Confident in the Holy Spirit's power and guidance, may God continue the good work begun in us and bring it to completion on the day of Christ Jesus (Phil 1:6).
