That God is faithful in every season is clearly reflected in the life of **Gerard Straub**, the keynote speaker for this year’s **Gallagher Talk on September 28, at 7 p.m.**

In his book, *The Sunrise of the Soul* (2020), Gerry shares “For years, I produced soap operas on all three major networks, including the wildly popular *General Hospital* on ABC. I was a big success. I had a glamorous job. I made tons of money. But something was missing. I had this emptiness inside of me. I tried to fill it with all kinds of things. But the emptiness would not go away. As I would discover, only God could fill my emptiness. God was who was missing in my life.”

While he had key moments of conversion, Gerry has learned that God’s abiding presence is noticed when we take the time to be attentive. “More often than not, I seem to be far from God. But in those moments, frequent as they are, God is near - so near, I do not have to struggle to find God, for God is already seeking me, rushing to embrace me.”

Today, Straub is a dad who provides a home of hope and healing for abandoned children at Santa Chiara Children’s Center of Haiti. Living with the poor, Gerry has discovered a wisdom that can only be learned by living the Gospel in a radical way.

## Friendship Corner

### Remembering Paulist Father Joseph Gallagher

**Father Joe Gallagher believed as strongly as the Paulist founder did, that creating a "future brighter than any past" would demand ministries that reached beyond local churches into the marketplace at the nexus of culture and faith.**

A native New Yorker, Father Gallagher received a bachelor's degree from the University of Notre Dame and was a U.S. Navy commander, landing ships in the Pacific during World War II. After the war, he earned a law degree at Fordham University and practiced maritime law in New York until joining the Paulists in 1956. Father Gallagher served at the Catholic Information Center in Boston, 1961-1964. He was director of the Paulist Institute for Religious Research in Manhattan until 1970 and was then appointed pastor and superior of St. Paul the Apostle. In 1978, Father Gallagher was elected vice president of the Paulist Fathers, serving simultaneously as Executive Director of the Catholic Information Center in Grand Rapids.

He was a pastor in Los Angeles, 1982-1986, when he was elected president of the society. During his two terms as president, Father Gallagher guided the Paulist Fathers to adopt a new mission statement that determined three major priorities for the order: evangelization, ecumenism and reconciliation.

At the conclusion of his service as president in 1994, he volunteered to serve in Grand Rapids, returning to the Catholic Information Center. Father Gallagher died on November 16, 2007 at the residence of the Paulist Fathers in Grand Rapids, Michigan.
